## From the Principal's Desk

One of the things we often find hard to do is to acknowledge the strengths of others. We are encouraged in the scriptures to be humble (e.g. James 4:6,10; 1Pet.5:5-6) and this can cause us to be wary of making too much of the good efforts of others. However, Paul encourages believers to "keep your eyes on those who walk according to the example you have in us" (Phil.3:17 ESV) and that "elders who rule well be considered worthy of double honour, especially those who labour in preaching and teaching" (1Tim.5:17 ESV).

The reality is, that it does us well to encourage each other to edify or build one another up. We have been set in the ecclesia for this very purpose. Paul says that by "speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love" (Eph.4:15-16 ESV). The phrase "joined...together" (or "fitly joined together" in the KJV) is one Greek word – *sunarmologeō* – which literally means "to be joined together by the things we speak of" (note Mal.3:16).

This term we are having a focus on acknowledging the strengths of others by giving "Build Up Merits" to students we see displaying the characteristics of Christ. When staff or other students see someone doing or saying something to build someone else up they will be given a "Build Up Merit". Most importantly, the person giving the merit will clearly acknowledge why they gave it. In this way, the characteristics of Christ, that will be preserved in immortality in the kingdom, will be emphasised and valued. In the end, we are all trying to help each other build towards the kingdom.

Wouldn't it be wonderful if our homes and ecclesias became filled with warm acknowledgements of our Godly efforts – and it can all start with us! When we see one of our children at home putting away the dishes without being asked, let's thank them and acknowledge their thoughtfulness. When we hear a great scriptural point at Bible class, let's tell the speaker we appreciated the stimulation of our spiritual thinking. When we see a young person encouraging one of their peers to act in a Godly way, let's praise their efforts – they may well be saving their friend!

By working together we can build each other up through the things we speak. As a result we will be built up a spiritual house which will stand forever, of which we will form precious stones alongside the faithful of all ages.
